Nature of support 2012/13

- Provision of one-to-one tuition
- Support for accessing school visits, residential trips, after-school clubs, and other out-of-school activities
- Small group interventions, lead by teaching assistant staff
- Provision of Family Support Worker hours, specifically directed to support the inclusion of Pupil Premium families and children

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2012/13

- One-to-one tuition for pupils in reading, writing and maths as appropriate
- Small group interventions in maths and reading in Key Stage 2
- Individual reading & phonics intervention in Key Stage 1

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

- All eligible children were offered funding for residential visits to enable them to access the associated parts of the curriculum
- Some children took the opportunity to access after-school clubs supporting their confidence within the class setting
- One pupil took advantage of the opportunity to take part in a high-quality out-of-school workshop
- The Family Support Worker engaged with the families of six eligible children, supporting better engagement with school, access to external services, providing advice and guidance as necessary

- In KS1, of the children in receipt of Pupil Premium
 - 100% passed the Y1 phonics check
 - 75% passed the Y2 phonics check
 - the Average KS1 points score was greater than national in reading, writing and maths

- In Years 3 – 5, of the children in receipt of Pupil Premium
 - 88% are making good progress in reading
 - 75% are making good progress in writing
 - 63% are making good progress in maths

- In Year 6, of the children in receipt of Pupil Premium
 - 100% attained at least Level 4 in maths and reading, and 75% in maths
 - average points were greater than those of non-Pupil Premium children in reading and maths
 - Value Added scores were better than those of non-Pupil Premium children in reading and maths
 - 100% made at least 2 levels progress in reading, writing and maths
