## Nature of support 2013/14

- Provision of one-to-one tuition
- Support for accessing school visits, residential trips, after-school clubs, and other out-of-school activities
- Small group interventions, lead by teaching assistant staff, including 1stClass@Number, Change4Life, Social Skills Groups and other Wave 2 interventions.
- Individualised programmes of support, lead by teaching assistant staff, including Precision Teaching and other Wave 3 interventions
- Support for involvement in *Achievement for All*
- Provision of Family Support Worker hours, specifically directed to support the inclusion of Pupil Premium families and children

## Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2013/14

- One-to-one tuition for pupils in reading, writing and maths as appropriate
- Small group interventions in maths and reading in Key Stage 2
- Individualised programmes of support in Key Stage 1 and 2 in maths, writing and reading
- Individual reading & phonics intervention in Key Stage 1 and EYFS

## Measuring the impact of PPG spending

- eight children accessed the *Achievement for All* programme
- fourteen children accessed support to attend after-school or out-of-school activities, residential visits and trips
- sixteen children received catch-up support, including 1-1 tuition, intervention programmes and individualised programmes
- sixteen children or their families received support from the school's Family Support Worker or counsellor
- of those children with end-of-year data:
  - 50% achieved a Good Level of Development in EYFS
  - 100% achieved the threshold mark for the Year 1 phonics screen
  - 100% achieved at least Level 4 in English and Maths at Key Stage 2
  - there were no children at the end of Key Stage 1
- of those children with progress data:
  - 93% are making at least expected progress in reading (20pps higher than in 2012/13)
  - 80% are making at least expected progress in writing (20pps higher than in 2012/13)
  - 80% are making at least expected progress in maths (14pps higher than in 2012/13)
