

# Pupil premium grant expenditure 2014-15



The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Year 11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces. From April 2012, the coverage of the premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. From April 2014, the coverage of the premium was widened again to include those children adopted from care since 2005.

How will the money be spent in 2014/15?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A percentage is spent on training for teachers to improve quality first teaching.</li><li>• A percentage of this income is spent on providing teaching assistants with high quality training (e.g. Phonics, 1stClass@Number) which then enables them to successfully support identified learners to raise attainment and achievement.</li><li>• A percentage is spent on funding small group interventions led by teaching assistants, including 1stClass@Number, Change4Life, Social Skills Groups and other Wave 2 interventions as well as individualised programmes of support including Precision Teaching and other Wave 3 interventions.</li><li>• A percentage is spent on 1:1 tuition, 1:2 tuition and small group focused sessions to support learning in reading, writing, phonics and maths as required.</li><li>• A percentage of the PPG grant helps to funding Family Support Worker hours, specifically directed to support the inclusion of Pupil Premium families.</li><li>• A percentage helps to fund counselling in the school for children with identified emotional and social needs which can be barriers to learning.</li><li>• A percentage supports access to school visits, residential trips, after-school clubs, and other out-of-school activities.</li><li>• A percentage support the financing of our <i>Achievement for All</i> programme.</li></ul>

**Statement about the effect of the expenditure on the educational attainment of those pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium**

Providing additional focused and targeted support enables eligible pupils to access the curriculum. The progress of the children is tracked and monitored regularly throughout the year and provision/support is changed and revised as required. As appropriate, children are supported with additional interventions (academic, social or emotional provision) so that all the children make at least expected progress year on year and have a positive self-esteem.
