- Discover the role of important people and events during the Roman period, such as Julius Caesar's attempted invasion and Boudicca.




As Geographers we will:

- Design a Roman temple, using an accurate scaled drawing of the temple, with labels, to communicate their ideas.
- Formulate a step-by-step plan to follow.
- Select tools and equipment suitable for the task.
- Follow procedures for safety when handling tools.
- Accurately measure, mark out, shape and assemble components and materials.

- Describe the different roles of those involved in a bullying situation and describe different types of prejudice driven bullying. Recognise and value the differences between people and how that can be a positive aspect of their friendships. (PSHE)

As Sports People we will:

- Improve our skills & techniques in dance and gym. PE is on a Monday & Tuesday.

As Mathematicians we will:

- Compare and order fractions whose denominators are all multiples of the same number.
- Identify, name and write equivalent fractions.
- Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator and denominators that are multiples of the same number.

- Teach grammar and punctuation.
- Improve our narrative writing by using a range of simple, compound and complex sentences and using paragraphs to structure our work.
