- Name and describe the properties of shapes.
- Practice our fluency in counting and calculation.
- Solve real life problems involving measurement in kg, cm, m and ml.



In PSHCE we will:

- Know how to keep safe when we are out and about.



In Music we will:

- Make up new words for a familiar melody.

- Apply sounds we know in our writing.
- Spell words that do not follow the usual phonetic patterns (common exception words).
- Write a letter to someone we know.
- Write our own information text about a famous person.




