



## Pupil Premium Spending: September 2016- July 2017

### What is Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Year 11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces.

From April 2012, the coverage of the premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. From April 2014, the coverage of the premium was widened again to include those children adopted from care since 2005.

Whilst schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit, we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium.

#### Funding for the academic year September 2016 – July 2017

Funding of £32,520 is received in two blocks : £18,970 from financial year April 2016-March 2017, and £13,550 from April 2017-March 2018.
