## Glorious Growing

Communication and Language (C\&L):

- Able to ask appropriate questions and respond to questions appropriately
- Use an increasing range of vocabulary
- Listen carefully and maintain focus during whole class, small group and individual work
- Able retell and discuss familiar stories e.g. our new topic book 'Oliver's Vegetables'


Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED):

- Able to build constructive, respectful and positive relationships with peers and adults
- Able to identify and moderate their own feelings and behaviours
- Able to listen to others and respect their views and choices
- Give focused attention to what adults and peers say
- Self-select learning activities and ability to explore new/ different activities with confidence

Physical Development (PD) and PE:

- Able to use large equipment and play outside in large areas safely (e.g. Forest School)
- Able to move with developing control and know how to combine different movements with ease and fluency (e.g. dance movements representing the life cycle of a plant)
- Developing skills to become confident, competent and creative movers
- Manipulate and use equipment safely and accurately to create things e.g. junk modelling
- Understanding the World (UW) learn about farm animals, farm

Mathematics:

- Able to combine two groups together
- Making pairs
- Exploring length and height

- Vegetable printing artwork
- Observational paintings of Spring flowers
- Non-fiction fact books about plants/ growing
- Able to retrieve simple information from non-fiction books
- Children learn and use vocabulary from books e.g. seed, stem
- Name all of the letters of the alphabet as well as know the phonics sounds
- Able to blend and read an increasing amount of words
- Able to segment and write an increasing amount of words
- Learn about the Easter Story and able to retell and discuss it
life and Spring (growing, life cycles)
- Forest school sessions
- Learn the basics of how humans grow from a baby to an adult
- Learn about animal life cyclesanimals grow from babies to adults- see lambs/ piglets first hand at Church Farm
- Growing seeds and watching their development
- Able to label different parts of a plant
