Birch Class Trip to Hunstanton

Last Wednesday, Birch Class went on an exciting end of year trip to Hunstanton where we visited the Sea Life Centre and the beach. This was part of our Coastline project and gave the children the opportunity to see firsthand many of the things we have been learning in the classroom, as well as to explore all of the animals and generally have fun after a successful year in Year 2!

At the Sea Life Centre, the children walked through a brilliant glass tunnel, seeing a wide variety of different marine life swimming all around them, including shark giant turtles, huge fish and many others. W were also fortunate enough to see the penguins being fed and two baby seals which had recently been rescued and were being nursed back to health.

Lunchtime was spent on the beach, ensurir that the seagulls didn't try to steal our food. We then spent the afternoon playing, building sandcastles, collecting shells and rocks and getting soaked in the rather chilly sea! Everyone had a fantastic but slightly we time and the children were a credit to Girton Glebe! A huge thank you to the parent volunteers that accompanied us and well done Birch Class.



On Monday 3rd July, Cherry class visited Mountfitchet Castle near Stansted to go back in time to 1066 and explore life in a Motte and Bailey castle as part of our History project on The Normans. We got to see firsthand how the Normans lived and how their castles were built and realised just how brutal they really were in their punishments! The class had a fantastic day exploring the castle and museum and the children were very well behaved and enjoyed every minute of this educational trip! It was great to see a real Motte and Bailey castle after designing and creating our own in our DT lessons over recent weeks. We have loved learning all about 1066 and this trip was a fun and exciting way to wrap up our final project of Year 4!
