Cherry Class Update

We have had a busy Autumn term in Cherry, including being the first class of the year to showcase everything we have learnt this year in our Class Assembly, which took place last Thursday. In this 30 minute round-up of all of our learning, we shared writing from Anti-Bullying week, demonstrated our Science knowledge by acting out how particles behave in solids, liquids and gases, and sang 'Try Everything' from Zootopia which represents how Cherry Children try everything even if we find it hard!

In English and Guided Reading, we've been diving deeper into our class text, 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' by Onjali Q. Rauf. The story follows the journey of Ahmet, a new boy at school who the main characters try to befriend. They soon discover that Ahmet is a refugee, separated from his family. As part of our learning, we've started to write persuasive letters, advocating for

the protection and care of refugees. We'd love to share some compelling facts and statistics about refugees with you - just ask us!

In Science, we've been exploring states of matter and using thermometers to develop our accuracy in measuring while checking the temperature of water, ice and other substances.

The theme of antibullying has been an important focus in our PSHE lessons as we have looked at reasons why we should not bully and that we should always tell a trusted adult if we ourselves or someone we know is being affected by this. We've also delved into the concept of growth and fixed mindsets, helping us to persevere and build our resilience whilst completing challenging work and assessments in our first term of Year 4.
