Celebration Assembly



First of all, we are excited to welcome back to Girton Glebe our Deputy Head and new IB Lead, **Jo Pyle**! Jo returned from maternity leave this week and we are over the moon to have her back at school. Here is Jo's first update of many on our journey towards delivering the IB curriculum:

"I am very excited to be returning to school and taking on the role as school IB Lead. I count myself lucky to work alongside such dedicated staff to develop this inquiring and knowledgeable Primary Years Programme (PYP) at Girton.

Even though we are at the start of our IB journey, so much has already been done to ensure a successful journey to authorisation. During the Summer, Mr Butler and I completed our category 1 IB training, whilst, in school, all teachers have been reading, researching and delivering CPD specific to the philosophy and approach of the PYP. This has given us all a firm foundation to start developing our PYP.

Earlier this academic year, Mr Butler and I were also lucky enough to visit two primary IB schools to see the PYP being delivered in action and learn from their expertise. This was an invaluable experience where we saw some outstanding provision in place, which we look forward to developing and implementing for our pupils at Girton.

Alongside this, we have been having regular meetings with Jo Sale, the Trust IB Lead. Jo brings with her a wealth of IB knowledge and is supporting us to road map our IB journey.

I am sure you will agree that it has been a very busy academic year already, with lots of preparations happening and two very successful Open Afternoons! All the staff at Girton are excited to begin developing our PYP ready for it to start in September. "




