Their project-themed assembly taught us how to wash a woolly mammoth, how to create pinch pots from clay, and how to create stone henge out of custard creams!

With everything from musical talent to incredible scientific knowledge about how light travels, every child had something to offer in their uplifting showcase of their recent learning. Perhaps the most unique part of this assembly was the song the children performed at the end, using drumsticks to tap, thwack and thump the rhythm of S Club 7's Reach. The class worked brilliantly as a team, working together to keep time and showing wonderful perseverance when they had to start again.

It was great to see Year 3 so clearly enjoying all of their learning and to see the whole class involved, smiling, and sharing their work with confidence. The class were supportive of each other throughout the assembly and it was lovely to see so many

It has been an exciting start to the term in Lime Class with our new project 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles'. Last week, we built volcanoes out of Lego and, using bicarbonate of soda and vinegar, created an eruption! We worked as a team to create some fabulous volcanoes and all really enjoyed watching the chemical reactions occur.

In project this week we have been learning about sedimentary, igneous, and metaphoric rocks and how they are formed. We spent the afternoon being Geologists and investigated whether the rocks were hard or soft, had layers, were permeable or impermeable and used magnifying glasses to look closely at them.

Supporting Biodiversity


The Garden will host a greater variety of plants that will lead to increased diversity of wildlife.
