
Celebration Assembly

Special Lent Assembly

On Monday this week, friends of the school Reverend Michael and Eona from St Andrew's Church delivered an informative assembly about the true meaning of Lent. Sharing the contents of her shopping bag (oil, flour, milk, eggs, lemons & chocolate spread) with the school, Eona asked the children if they could guess what this week's assembly would be about...

The pupils were very excited to know all about "Pancake Day" and to hear about Tuesday's Pancake Party at the church, but Eona wanted to spread the true meaning of Shrove Tuesday and why this day is celebrated by Christians around the world.

With the help of some very excited Year 5 & 6 pupils, Eona discussed the ways in which you might prepare for an important event such as a marathon or long race, including why this might be difficult and the self-discipline you'd need to show to not put things off or avoid the challenge altogether.

Eona then shared the story of Jesus spending 40 days and 40 nights preparing for the hard challenges that he had to face, focusing on fighting temptations and making good choices. She explained how some people may give up things, such as chocolate or social media, during the period that Christians call Lent, while others may take up new challenges. Sharing her own challenge of a daily "Blessings Jar" in which Eona plans to collect one good memory from each day during Lent, she challenged the children to consider what they could take up to form positive habits in the run up to Easter.

Thank you to St Andrew's Church for this lovely assembly; we look forward to your next visit before the Easter holidays!



Cherry Class Update

This half term has been a busy one for us, from forest school to a Bushcraft Adventure workshop afternoon, to reading and writing with our buddies AND completing Maths Day activities... but we have loved and enjoyed it all.

In Maths, we have been looking at finding the perimeter of rectangles and polygons. We have also continued to work on our multiplication skills and have worked on ensuring we can answer our daily 10 (multiplication tables up to 12x12) in under 5 seconds for each question to help with our upcoming MTC.

In English, we have finished 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' which we loved and have learnt so much about how to look after each other. We also learnt lots of facts about Buckingham Palace and enjoyed writing non-chronological reports to share with the younger classes. 
