Gardening Club Success!

On Monday (Earth Day), we heard from the school's Gardening Club and our gardening volunteer, Alison Giles, about the club's recent successes and ambitions for the future in our whole school assembly. Alison, who works as part of Girton's local nature recovery plan, explained how her and her team are working to improve Girton's green spaces, making these nicer for both people and animals – including improving our very own pond and wildlife area!

Our dedicated Gardening Club have been busy weeding since Spring began, in preparation for planting flowers and vegetables for the children and creatures (such as butterflies and other bugs and small animals) to enjoy. They have already planted a row of potatoes and can't wait to see how these turn out!

The children of Gardening Club shared with the school their best and worst parts of being gardeners, as well as what they have learned about growing plants and what they are growing at home. Some of the best things about being part of Gardening Club were: watching things magically grow from a seed; helping nature to thrive; and feeling calm and relaxed while outside. Lydia told us, "I love gardening with my best friend beside me while I'm making room for nature to roam." The downsides of gardening shared in assembly were getting mucky, being stung by nettles and the British weather! Well done to all of the members of this club who are not only helping to improve the school's garden, but growing plants such as raspberries, sunflowers, spinach, tomatoes, kale, mint, rosemary and bluebells at home, too!

Alison also shared with the school the club's recent success at earning the RHC's School Gardening Award Level 1: this required getting outside and planting something. In order to achieve Level 2, Gardening Club are keen to get more people involved and to hear our pupils' opinions, recommendations and suggestions for the school garden in the future. Following this assembly, Gardening

Club plan to plant sunflowers, waterlilies, peonies, peas and herbs, as requested by children from around the school!
