Cherry Class Update

This half term has seen us begin new topics and units in all of our subjects. We have started a new project called '1066'. During our project lessons we have been learning about the Battle of Stamford Bridge and the Battle of Hastings.

In Maths, we have been looking at decimals. We have learnt about tenths and hundredths as a fraction and a decimal and looked at partitioning decimals as well as adding and subtracting them.

Our English this term is linked to our project on 1066. We have started our new book called 'I was there, 1066, The Norman conquest' by Jim Eldridge. We have looked at the 3 claimants to the throne after Edward the

Confessor died and have

written persuasive speeches convincing the Witan who should be crowned the next King of England. We have also looked at the features of a non-chronological report and have started writing our reports on Motte and Bailey castles, the Bayeux Tapestry or the 3 claimants to the throne.

We have started to look at how to take care of our teeth in Science, as well as looking after our allotment in school, playing Tennis and Athletics in PE and

discussing different relationships in PSHE, where we have looked at the different stages of grief and how we keep the memory of people and pets alive once they are gone.

In other exciting news, we have received a reply from the Home Office about our letters to Mr Cleverly on refugees and asylum seekers whilst studying the book 'The boy at the back of the class'. Dr.M Elimelech thanked us for our letters and explained a bit more about how the UK help refugees and asylum seekers. We were very happy to receive a reply and thank them for taking the time to read our work.
