

Sport Premium: Expenditure 2023-24

Sport Premium Funding, also known as Olympic Legacy Funding, was announced by the government in March 2013 to run from September 2013 to August 2015. This deadline was then extended, the funding was allocated, and ringfenced, to be spent on PE and sport with guidance on how it could be spent.

For 2023-24 financial year we received £15400

CPD

This year we have sent members of staff to SCSSP gymnastics, swimming and dance workshops as well as had bespoke swimming teaching training delivered by staff from IVC.

Mid-day Supervisor training

This has really helped to enhance the amount of physical activity the children are taking part in. We are now using our playground equipment really well and this is supported by staff and our Y5/6 leaders.

Balanceability and Scooterbility

The SCSSP have helped us to run Balanceability for Reception and Scooterbility for Y1.

“The improvement seen through the Scooterbility course was very evident and it was also very helpful to learn how to teach Scooterbility and have a chance early in the year to focus on the children’s physical literacy and their core body strength. “ -KS1 Teacher

Top up swimming

A group of 7 of our Y6 children have attended the top up swimming lessons at IVC.

“Top Up swimming has been an invaluable asset to Year 6 Top Up swimmers. All seven children have improved massively and can now swim adequately in deep water. They also have gained the confidence to jump in.”- KS2 TA

Swimming Pool

The Swimming pool has been well used in the Summer 2 half term. Each class has had two lessons a week. “We have seen fantastic progress in swimming. Two lessons a week really enables them to practice what they have learned and gain a lot of confidence and technique in the water.”- KS1 Teacher

Many year groups have had their swimming lessons supported by an external swimming teacher as well as P.E./Swimming teachers from IVC. This has enabled those teachers new to teaching swimming to learn from the experienced teachers.

We have also taken advantage of Top up lessons run by IVC for some of our Y6 cohort.

SCSSP/ IVC support with swimming

This year we have spent some of our Sports Premium money on upskilling the teachers and teaching assistants by having their lessons supported by a specialist P.E. teacher from IVC which have included swimming.

Sports Clubs

There has been very good uptake again for our afterschool sports clubs. These include, gymnastics, multi-sports, girls’ football, Tri-club, Taekwon-do and netball. Children and parents show great enthusiasm for these clubs.

We funded several clubs with Sports premium Money. These were girls and boys football for years 3-6 and also a netball club for Y5/6. The girls football clubs and netball club both led up to SCSSP sports competitions. Our teams excelled in the girls football competitions and the netball team got through two rounds and placed very well in the third round of competition. The participation across all three clubs was very good and has had a lasting impact on those children involved.

“I think the netball and football club because they are fun and the exercise keeps you athletic and at competitions you get a chance to represent your school. It feels good .”- Y5 Child

School Partnership Sports Competitions

This year we entered several SCSSP competitions including the Cross country , Y5/6 Girls Football Y3/4/ Girls football, Y3/4/ Dynamo Cricket . We ran team practices for the cross country, girls' football and cricket festivals leading up to the competitions which were very well attended making selection for each competition difficult.
