The form will be available until Monday 4th November. Many thanks and we look forward to seeing you at one of the sessions.










Maple Class Update

This term, our IB inquiry has been an exciting journey into celebrating what makes us unique and understanding how this sense of uniqueness helps us belong. We've explored our own traits, our families, and even mapped out our cultural backgrounds in fun, hands-on activities.

As part of Black History Week, we had an extra special Show and Tell with Sierra, who shared a beautiful dress and introduced us to akara, a tasty sweet treat from Sierra Leone. It was such a wonderful way to celebrate different cultures right in our classroom!

In our inquiry, we've also been reading The Ugly Duckling, a story that has sparked some interesting discussions about belonging. We've been reflecting on how the Ugly Duckling felt when he was different from those around him and whether he should have needed to change to feel accepted. We discussed how important it is to be true to ourselves and not to change just to fit in. This led us to think about how we can make our own community more inclusive, where everyone feels they belong just as they are.



Soon, we'll be exploring Coming to England by Floella Benjamin, which will help us dive deeper into themes of belonging and community. Through storytelling, art, and shared experiences, we're learning to appreciate each other's unique backgrounds. We can't wait to see where this inquiry will take us next! Black History Week

This week, following a whole-school assembly led by Miss Pyle on historic figures, every class has celebrated Black History Month with a week of learning about inspirational and influential black figures as part of our IB Inquiries into Who We Are. These lessons took the form of Art, Reading and Writing lessons and link not only with our IB explorations, but also our whole-school PSHE topic of Being Me In My World.. Here's what we've been up to...

Ash: Alma Woodsey Thomas (exploring colour-mixing and tone as part of our exploration of different likes and dislikes and linking to our upcoming work on our emotions)



Maple: Floella Benjamin (exploring our question "Is it important to feel a sense of belonging in the community?" through the reading of her book, Coming to England)

Birch: **Benjamin Zephaniah** (reading 'People Need People' as part of our English and Inquiry work linked to our first line of inquiry "What is our community like?" and using this to write a class poem about our community)

Lime: Jean -Michel Basquiat (learning about his life and the experiences he told about through paintings as we create our own artworks linked to Who We Are.

Cherry: **Mary Seacole** (discussing and drawing parts of her life that represent resilience and key moments where she shaped history, as part of our Inquiry into Who We Are.





Willow: **Katherine Johnson** (researching the "Women who made NASA" and linking to our Inquiry by thinking about how trailblazers influence, inspire and impact people of today; we have created a biographical leaflet)

Oak: **Amy Ida Louisa King, Gloria Cumper & Priscilla Mensah** (exploring and drawing three local Heroes of Girton who made history and attended Girton College, as part of our Inquiry into Who We Are in our local area)
