#### **Healthy Snacks Reminder**




#### **Birch Class Update**

We have had an exciting start to the year in Birch class, diving into our first IB inquiry focused on the central idea 'Communities promote relationships, values and responsibilities to support those living in them.'

In our inquiry sessions, the children have thought about what it means to be part of a community, and the rights and responsibilities that this entails. During this topic, we have explored our school grounds and planned ways to help keep our environment clean and tidy, as well as practising being kind to others around us and supporting our community by being a kind friend.

This half term, Birch class have read Benjamin Zephaniah's heartwarming book 'People Need People'. After reading, the children reflected on the important people in their lives and communities, thinking about why these people mean a lot to them and what they like to do together.





Taking inspiration from the text, the class wrote beautiful poems about their friends and families that they should be very proud of!

The children have also explored our inquiry through Art: they have been looking at murals and considering the ways that Art can represent a community and bring people together. After some careful planning and lots of creative ideas, the class have painted mural-inspired artwork that represents every child in their own special way. Well done Birch for creating some lovely pieces of art and writing this half-term!

Well done! Gertie the Girton Goose will continue to visit different pupils and classes each Friday after half-term, as we continue to choose pupils at random from the winning house each week.






