- For KS2 SATS: 13% achieved the higher standard in Reading, Writing, and Maths placing us in the top 20% nationally!
- In the Multiplication Tables Check, 41% of pupils scored full marks, again above the national average.
- 80% of Y1s passed the Phonics Screening Check.

These results reflect the hard work, dedication, and enthusiasm of our pupils — and the brilliant support from our staff and families. We're proud of every child's achievement and excited to keep building on this success!

- Year 6: The Arrival by Shaun Tan




We're excited to see the children's writing flourish as the term progresses and can't wait to share their creative work with you in future newsletters.


