What an extraordinary day of music-making we had! Our pupils were treated to an unforgettable performance and workshops from the talented duo Stewart and Chris, who took everyone on a musical journey "Around the World in 60 Minutes – The Sequel."

The performance began in Rio de Janeiro with a vibrant South American Samba Band, before travelling across continents to experience the sounds of an Aboriginal Didgeridoo, a Bavarian Gems Horn, a Zulu Warrior's Kudu Horn, and even a Cimbasso from early Italian opera. The journey continued through the Far East, featuring a stunning Tibetan Dung encrusted with jewels, and across the Atlantic to New Orleans, where the swingin' Sousaphone stole the show.
