Anti-Bullying Week: 'Power for Good'


This week, our school has been taking part in Anti-Bullying Week, with the inspiring theme 'Power for Good.'

We began the week on Monday with a whole-school assembly, where we explored what it means to use our Power for Good. Together, we reflected on how each of us has the power to be kind, to include others, and to speak up when we see someone being treated unfairly.

Throughout the week, classes have deepened this message through thoughtful discussions and a range of creative activities. From designing your own superhero and writing a comic strip on how they use their power for good in Year 2 to understand the role of a bystander in Year 3, the children produced work they can be truly proud of, showing real understanding of how their words and actions can make a positive difference to others.

Willow Class explored the theme of 'power for good' through their Writing Root book, *Hidden Figures*. They reflected on how the four pioneering African American women at NASA used their talents and determination as a true power for good – not only by helping to change laws and end segregation at NASA, but also by playing a vital role in sending Americans into space. Their perseverance and achievements paved the way for future generations of women and people of colour, showing what can be accomplished through courage and resilience.

The school was also a vibrant sea of odd socks on Monday, as both staff and pupils wore them to celebrate what makes each of us unique. The odd socks reminded us all that it's great to be different – and that kindness and acceptance help make our school a place where everyone belongs.


